STATE VICTIM ADVOCATE

Are you an attorney who has the passion and professional experience to fulfill the role of State Victim Advocate? If so, we are seeking an attorney with extensive experience in advocating on behalf of the constitutional and statutory rights of crime victims in the criminal justice process to be the Victim Advocate for the State of Connecticut.

Connecticut assumed a national leadership role by establishing the first Office of the Victim Advocate (OVA) in 1998. Its role is to advance victims' rights and promote fair and just treatment of victims throughout the criminal justice system. The OVA currently employs four staff and has an annual budget of \$441,000. A seven member Advisory Committee has been charged with the responsibility to recruit and submit a list of candidates to the Governor for appointment of the Victim Advocate pursuant to Public Act 11-48, Section 68.

THE RESPONSIBILITIES

The Victim Advocate will enter into cooperative agreements with public and/or private agencies to further the constitutional rights of victims; receive, review, investigate complaints, and provide advocacy concerning the actions of entities providing services to victims; review procedures and evaluate the delivery of services by state agencies and other entities as they relate to constitutional and statutory rights of victims (and their families); promote and conduct education programs to advise the public of the mission and services of OVA; undertake legislative advocacy on behalf

of crime victims and make proposals for systemic reform; ensure a centralized location for victim services information; prepare and submit an annual report as required by statute; maintain and update the OVA website with current, accurate and relevant information and appropriate resource links; may be required to appear in court in order to vindicate a crime victim's constitutional or statutory rights. Within the Office of Government Accountability, the Victim Advocate is the Chief Executive of the Office of the Victim Advocate and has responsibility for formulation and execution of the office budget for planning, expenditures, personnel and staffing needs.

QUALIFICATIONS

A minimum of four years experience as an attorney*; extensive knowledge and experience in advocating on behalf of crime victims; experience or working knowledge of the criminal justice system, the legislative system and process, and the ability to undertake legislative initiatives. The ideal candidate will have experience as an independent leader and supervisor, documented exceptional oral and written communication skills, experience as a skilled and diplomatic negotiator, and as a persuasive public speaker; experience providing direct services to victims; experience or the ability to work with the media, ability to effectively collaborate with multiple individuals and organizations.

TERM OF OFFICE: The Governor, with the approval of the General Assembly, shall appoint the Victim Advocate. The person appointed Victim Advocate shall serve for a term of four years and may be reappointed.
