# How Can Connecticut Make That Happen?

Connecticut municipalities are creating a wider variety of affordable homes for low- and moderate-income families. Whether those families will grab those new choices is a different issue. Some will stay in their neighborhoods, among friends, family and religious and cultural anchors. Others will want to move.

But mobility concerns - will there be help in moving, security deposit assistance, counseling on how to succeed in a new community and ways to overcome other barriers? - can keep families from accessing higher-resource schools and communities with the jobs, services and transit access they want.

A look at housing affordability, how the state is fostering a wider array of options in new municipalities, how parents are making choices and how schools and communities are helping them prosper where they've been living, or in their new surroundings.
