Previous teaching experience at the undergraduate level is highly desirable.

The course is taught twice a week (Tues, Thurs, 9:25-10:40 AM) in a computer lab where all work stations are running ArcGIS 10.2.2. Any text for the course is at the instructor's discretion but historically students have worked through the ESRI Press Workbook: Tutorial 1. Class size averages approximately 15 students. Students from multiple disciplines take the GIS course including: Environmental Science, Urban Studies and Economics.
