Generalized Comments (positives)

- Improved processing power, runs faster on new computers
- Better cartography
- The ribbon is intuitive and user-friendly
- Better interface with ArcGIS Online
- Easier for new users to learn
- Layouts are superior
- Less clicking overall
- Editing is simpler
- Software is supported and updates are automatic
- Works better with AutoCAD

Generalized Comments (negatives)

- Learning curve
- Changes in data & file management practices are difficult to understand/implement
- Not an intuitive interface
- Losing the time invested in creating customized scripts, tools, and teaching curriculum
- Need to migrate legacy projects
- Others in the organization haven't/won't switch
- Some processes are very slow and fail
- May require computer/server upgrades
- Lack of support for some extensions, model builder, database and export formats
